





I am terribly sorry that your wonderful letter of last May was mislaid and has only now surfaced out of the chaos that I call my desk. I know it is too late for me to participate in your fifth grade class report, but I am writing to you personally, anyway, because your question is of great importance.

I was born a Presbyterian in Steubenville, Ohio, in 1922. From the beginning I was told that God existed, a fact which I never challenged but which I accepted as a bit of history - George Washington, Abraham Lincoln and God all existed in about equal parts.

I know now that He was making His presence known to me all along, but I did not actually <u>let</u> Him make His presence known - that is I did not stop to see it and feel it - until thirteen years ago when I was forty-eight years old. He was everywhere: in my father's "talis" (prayer shawl), in his tefilin (philactories) that appeared on my father's arm and forehead every morning, in the cracked voice of the neighborhood cantor who was a glazier by trade, in the chanting of the small, poor devoted congregation, but most of all I saw God in the arc which housed the precious Torahs, the scrolls covered with soft velvet material and decorated in "gold thread" with the great lion of Judah. When these huge scrolls were lifted high into the air, I held my breath. "If a Torah is dropped," my father would say, "it would be a tragedy of immense proportions. We would have to fast for forty days and nights to compensate." In the torahs, to me, lay the secrets of the universe. Here God's breath permeates the elegant Hebrew letters covering the strong parchment. But God's presence was everywhere in my life, especially on the Sabbath eve and during the high holy days. When the ram's horn (Shofar) was sounded at the close of Yom Kippur (day of atonement), it was God's voice I heard forgiving us all for our sins. Today I still find God in shul and in the memory of my parents, plain and simple Jewish folk who gave me an everlasting gift of cultural continuity.




