Thank you very much for your letter. I am sorry it has taken me this time to answer your letter, but I was out of the country lecturing in Canada.

Yes, I do believe in God, and although I received a traditional Roman Catholic education, I did not have any direct meditational experience of higher states of consciousness until my 18th year. At that time, while I was listening to the Ninth String Quartet of Beethoven, I experienced an uplifting of my normal consciousness into a higher one. The experience changed my life, and all the years of Yogic practice and intellectual study come out of that experience. The Plains Indians of America used to take their young men out of the settlement and into the woods, where they would fast and meditate to receive a vision of their guardian spirit. This vision was then called a "power vision" and was considered to shape the entire future life of the young men. The great Irish poet, W. B. Yeats, also has indicated that one is given a vision of his life's work in his teens and the rest of one's life is simply the working out of that original vision.



First of all, I would like to appologize for having taken so long to write you. But I have been very, very busy and don't often write personal responses to the letters I recieve just for that reason. But I felt moved to answer yours for two reasons: One being that you happened to ask me a question on a subject that is very important to me, and, two, I was impressed that someone as young as yourself was interested in asking it. So, here is my answer.

Most definitely, yes, I do believe in God. I had always believed that there was a God, but now I definitely know there is a God because it did make itself known to me and here is the story of how it happened.

About a year ago I was driwing down the street, just having been to my doctor's office where he had told me after an examination that I had a cyst in one of my breasts. This is something I have suffered with from time to time all through my adult life, as some women do, but this was the first time that one was big enough to have to be removed by surgery. And in such cases, the fear always is that the cyst might be cancerous, and they can never tell if it is or it isn't until after they operate. Before I go any further, I just re-

Well, incase your parents aren't close by to explain it to you, a cyst is an unnatural growth of tissue somewhere in the body. Very, very alone and scared, and then I heard a voice, not through my ears, exactly, like you would hear another person's voice, but kind of from inside of me, but it wasn't me thinking because I know the difference, and it said "I'm here with you, and everything is going to be all right." And then I felt this warmth fill my whole body, kind of like there was a light inside of me, and I stopped crying and looked around me and everything looked very bright and peaceful. It was like one moment I was in terror and the next I was in absolute peace. And I know that was the voice of God because it gave me such peace. Not only that, but it didn't lie, because I went on to have the surgery and, guess what?... The cyst was benign, it was not cancerous, they removed it, and today I am absolutely fine.

And since then, a couple other things have happened to again prove to me the existance of God, but I don't need to go into them because I think the above story is the most important because it was the first time and it sure made a beliver

out of me!

Now, whenever things get very painful or hard, as they sometimes do in life, I'll remember that God proved its existance to me and I will try to take comfort in that fact and realize that all you have to do to have God in your life is to be consciously aware of it and choose God's Peace over the world's hypnotism.



The second salvo was short. The third salvo would have hit but, at that point, our torpedoes hit them and our U.S. battleships opened up on them. The Japanese shifted their fire and we were not hit. Afterwards, we discovered that every man on our ship was praying at that moment.

I have not always been constant in my prayers, but I have found that, in adversity, He is there and quite forgiving for my lapses.
